COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHT: STUDENT AMBASSADORS

We are thrilled to highlight our Student Ambassadors for their hard work and dedication throughout the year. Our Student Ambassadors are Summer Searchers in their high school junior and senior year who encourage prospective students to apply. Ambassadors share their experiences, build the Summer Search community in their schools, and connect with their peers to learn more about them and their interests.

In partnership with Student Ambassadors, our Outreach and Recruitment Team recruited the highest number of sophomores in Summer Search NYC history. We were so happy to enroll 155 sophomores into our program!

HIGH SCHOOL & MENTORING

Mentoring is the cornerstone of Summer Search. It permeates every program that we offer. Each Summer Searcher is matched with a paid full-time Mentor who meets students twice a month in their sophomore and junior year. Mentors also meet with seniors once a month. While building a connection with a Mentor may feel challenging at first, over time, students come to value the relationship and look forward to the support and reflections it brings.

Additionally, Summer Searchers participate in Group Mentoring sessions once per month for one hour. In these sessions, students have the guidance of their trusted Mentor and co-facilitators who are trained to help students think critically. Students also benefit from the support of their peers who bring their own experiences and perspectives into the conversation.

EVENT HIGHLIGHT: COMMUNITY FUN NIGHTS


We hosted two Community Fun Nights in our Manhattan and our Bronx offices. These events gave Summer Searchers a safe space to connect with their friends as they engaged in activities such as painting, creating mocktails, chess and checkers, and karaoke. We want to continue these nights to foster relationships with all our Summer Searchers from different schools and communities.













SUMMER EXPERIENCES

This summer, we were able to send 161 students on their Summer Experience trips. Our rising sophomore students mainly participated in wilderness experiences while our rising juniors participated in international trips, academic experiences, and internships. We offered 18 total Summer Experiences which ranged from canoeing trips in St. Croix to climbing the Himalayan Peaks in Nepal, from hiking the Appalachian Trail in West Virginia to volunteering with a Pre-Med program in Costa Rica.

Each program partner hosted an orientation for all participants and students were prepared by their Mentor by talking through expectations, managing challenges, and setting goals.

POST-SECONDARY PROGRAM

Highlights From the Year!

- We hosted a writing workshop where Summer Searchers from Stonehill College helped our high school seniors write their personal statements and college essays. The postsecondary students discussed their experiences as college students at Stonehill and shared details about the full scholarship that would be awarded to one Summer Searcher in the fall. We are happy to report that Summer Searcher Zulaiya received a full scholarship to Stonehill College!
- We launched our first ever "Post-Secondary Hangout" where high school students and post-secondary students could participate in game nights, build community with each other, and share their college experiences with our high school students.
- Our Summer Searchers have matriculated into college/universities all over the country including: Vaughn College of Aeronautics and Technology, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, St. Joseph's University, Spelman College, Clark Atlanta University, Georgia Institute of Technology, NYU, Fordham University, University of Central Florida, SUNY New Paltz, Hunter College, Bernard M. Baruch College, UPenn, and many others.

CAREER PROGRAM

Aspects of Career Programming

1:1 Career Navigator Support

- Provide individualized support and follow up with Summer Searchers exploring internships and job opportunities
- Connect Summer Searchers with a vast network of alumni, board members, volunteers, and supporters
- Facilitate workshops that deepen the technical skills of Summer Searchers to handle their finances, explore career interests, and make informed decisions about their post-secondary pathway

Career Fair

- Summer Searchers meet with representatives of companies to discuss entry level positions
- Representatives share their career journeys and give Summer Searchers insight into the different pathways that can lead to a desired role

Career Coaching Program

On April 24, 2024, we celebrated the successful completion of our 3-month Career Coaching Program, which connected 15 Summer Searchers with industry professionals. These coaches provided invaluable insights into navigating the professional world and offered guidance on how to align career goals with actionable steps.

One participant, Lisbeth (top left), shared how her coach, Thalia (top right), resonated with her on a personal level due to their similar backgrounds. Lisbeth reflected on the "different challenges Thalia faced and how she overcame them gives me hope for my own challenges. It helps me feel that I'm not alone in my experiences as a first-generation college student." This program is a testament to the power of mentorship, shared experiences, and the collective strength of overcoming barriers to achieve success.
